348 striking miners stand strong against Compass Minerals demands for mandatory overtime and cutting pension benefits.

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Funding cuts at Ontario's only French public broadcaster leads to 37 layoffs, including 11 members, and program cuts. READ MORE Four-year tentative agreement reached with Catalyst Paper and Unifor, representing approximately 750 workers in B.C.

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Privatization of Ontario's gaming industry leads to layoffs of workers in Sudbury, Point Edward and Dresden casinos.

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This two-tiered pilot allowing Uber and Lyfte at Toronto airport will hurt the livelihood of licensed taxi drivers.
