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IN THE NEWS



Following weeks of intense negotiations, Unifor has reached a tentative agreement with Ford Motor Company to be brought before members at upcoming ratification meetings.

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Unifor locals can order free Emancipation Day posters to help mark Aug. 1 in their workplaces and communities. Deadline to order is Monday, July 20.

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Register by July 31 for Unifor's Black, Indigenous, and/or Workers of Color Leadership program.

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Canfor's plans to close its Northwood pulp mill would eliminate 300 forestry jobs and further hobble the forestry supply chain in B.C. if it is allowed to proceed.

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Unifor has signed an agreement to bring members back to a reopened Hamilton biodiesel plant.

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Unifor's Human Rights Conference brought members to the union's Family Education Centre to spotlight activists and face the struggles ahead.

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Roughly 5,000 Unifor members and their families gathered at Canada's Wonderland for the union's annual Ontario region Member Appreciation Day.
