Auto Talks 2026 are officially underway. Unifor and Ford Motor Company have begun negotiations on a pattern setting collective agreement, covering more than 5,000 members.

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Unifor welcomes the focus on CANDU in the federal government's Nuclear Energy Strategy.

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As the Titan Tool & Die dispute nears 11 months, the company cut off retiree healthcare benefits and slashed pension payments.
