



IMPORTANT NOTICES

- 1. The safety of all participants in the parade is a priority. Liability for any accident involving a float and/or vehicle will be the SOLE responsibility of the organization which entered it in the parade. All passengers on floats and in vehicles must REMAIN SEATED UNTIL THEY HAVE REACHED THE DISPERSAL AREA.
- 2. ABSOLUTELY NO HELIUM BALLOONS ALLOWED.
- 3. ABSOLUTELY NO BUSES OR MOTORCYCLES

THE FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS MUST BE OBSERVED.

- 1. The parade marches off promptly at 9:30 a.m.
- 2. The parade assembles on University Avenue; Richmond Street; Dundas Avenue and Queen Street W. from Bay Street to University Avenue.
- 3. All cars, floats and trucks participating in the parade must be registered with the Labour Council. Permits are required for car/minivans to enter the parade marshalling area. Floats and flatbeds do not require permits.
- 4. All floats must be built by members of the Union they represent or by Union craftspeople. Floats must not exceed 13'4" (thirteen feet, four inches) in height to pass under the subway at Queen and Dufferin Streets, and no wider than 10' across in order to cross the Dufferin Bridge.
- 5. Those unions/locals wishing to have speakers, this must be done while you are marshalling your contingent. Under no circumstances are you permitted to delay the parade. If you have speakers and are delaying the parade, the next contingent in line will be moved out ahead of you.
- 6. Once inside the Dufferin Gates, all marchers must proceed to the entrance kiosk as directed by CNE staff. All vehicles must disperse in the designated area in the CNE Grounds. You will be directed by the Marshals. It would be greatly appreciated if each driver is given a copy of the dispersal area map. It will also be appreciated if you could advise the drivers of ALL VEHICLES to not stop along the dispersal route to drop passengers off.
- 7. Overcrowding and/or children hanging out of moving vehicles will not be allowed. No articles of any kind can be thrown from any float or vehicle. Garbage must be disposed of at the CNE in the appropriate containers.
- 8. Buses and taxis are not permitted to participate in the parade, but may enter the CNE at the usual bus entrance prior to the parade. Unions/Locals using buses to transport members must make separate arrangements with the CNE for parking. Members who are transported by buses are required to pay the appropriate entry fee into the CNE. Only participants who march in the parade and are wearing the appropriate wristbands will be allowed free entry into the CNE.
- 11. Non-affiliated groups will be allowed to march at the end of the parade subject to the Labour Council's approval. **Absolutely no vehicles of any kind are permitted in this section.**

WRISTBANDS

In order to have free entry into the CNE after the parade, all marchers **MUST** each have an official wristband issued by the CNE.

Each Union/Local must advise Maureen King at 416-441-3663 ext. 222 or at mking@labourcouncil.ca no later than August 19th of the number of wrist bands required by your contingent. **Please do not overestimate your members' participation.**

IMPORTANT NOTICE

It is important that unused wristbands be returned to the marshal of your section for possible re-distribution to those Unions/Locals that may not have enough.

Please refrain from distributing your spares to spectators along the parade route. Each year we see or are told by others that wristbands are being sold to others instead of being used by the individuals who received them.
